THE DEMAND-SIDE OF DIGITAL IDENTITY

Linking digital identity systems with service delivery and empowering use cases in a manner that is attractive and inclusively accessible to the population is a complex business. It is not just about technology, or identity verification. It requires among other things, careful considerations of the user experience, instilling confidence, and trust in the system by both users and relying parties, a deep understanding of sectoral needs and business workflows, and achieving high levels of availability of the platforms that support the delivery applications. This session begins with a special segment on lessons learned from India's success with the use of digital identity, it then analyzes the economic value of identity, followed by an examination of the experiences of some key sectors that already rely on digital identity. S2: BUILDING DIGITAL PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE

This segment starts with a special presentation on the India Stack experience, covering digital identity, payments, data empowerment and G2P platforms that have been accelerating government reforms in India. Civil registration continues to be a major challenge for legal identity in Africa. Despite notable progress around the Continent, it is becoming clear that unless countries embrace new ways of doing business around civil registration, many countries in Africa will fail to meet SDG 16.9 by 2030. In view of the critical importance of this challenge, ID4Africa, along with its development partners—UNICEF and OpenCRVS, is holding this workshop to explore the possibility of developing a standardized game-changing platform for the digitalization of CRVS on the Continent. This shared asset would be built on open-source and would be freely available to all African countries to exploit in their reforms of their civil registration practices. This workshop promotes dialogue among the African civil registration stakeholders to assess desirability, timelines, milestones, governance and election



of leadership, sustainability, establish principles, and the technical pathway to arriving at the desired platform starting with Digital Public Goods.

PRIVACY & DATA PROTECTION IN IDENTIFICATION SYSTEMS
Chairing Entity: Office of the Data Protection Commissioner, Kenya

African Data Protection Authorities (DPAs) play a key role in the development and regulation of digital transformation programs and identity systems. This is as expected given the data-rich nature of these initiatives and their potential to be invasive to privacy of those they seek to benefit. The objective of this workshop is to give a voice to the DPAs around Africa and to enable them to shape the development agenda by articulating their concerns and recommendations on acceptable risk mitigation and data protection practices, and key regulatory considerations to be factored into such initiatives.
